Master of Laws

The philosophy of the LL.M. program is to offer students a broad platform to design their own course of study within parameters set by the MCL law faculty.

For international students, the program emphasizes exposure to U.S. law, a comparison of U.S. and other legal systems, and advanced legal theory and policy. Subject to criteria established by the State Bar of California, the LL.M. may qualify a foreign-educated graduate to sit for the California Bar Exam.

Vision & Mission

Monterey College of Law's mission is to provide a quality legal education in a community law school setting with graduates who are dedicated to professional excellence, integrity, and community service. Applicants to the LL.M. Program must have received their first degree in law at either an American Bar Association (ABA) approved law school, a state-accredited law school, or at a law school approved by the appropriate authority in a country other than the United States.

In addition, MCL will consider any applicant, domestic or international, who is licensed to practice law and is currently in good standing in the jurisdiction in which they are licensed.

Graduation Requirements

The LL.M. degree requires the successful completion of 24 graduate law units, including a capstone thesis. In addition to the capstone thesis, LL.M. students may take doctrinal, skills, or elective courses.

Transfer credits will be allowed for certain graduate and law courses that meet MCL's academic standards. If approved, transfer credits may be applied towards up to one-half of the 24-unit graduation requirement.

Learning Outcomes are Institution Wide Competencies


<u>ILO1 Doctrinal Knowledge:</u> Students will master knowledge and understanding of pertinent principles and theories of the law, their relationships, and their limitations.

<u>ILO2 Professional Analytics (critical thinking)</u>: Students will analyze the legal rules and principles applicable to a problem and formulate legal theories. Students will apply problem solving skills to diagnose a legal problem, generate alternative solutions, and develop a plan of action.




