Please review your degree requirements and this course catalogue before filling out the Clinical Course Application.

Your registration application is due **WEDNESDAY**, July 16th, 2025. All applications will be reviewed after the deadline, without regard to the order in which they were received. Accordingly, please take your time in carefully reviewing these materials and preparing your application. You are only registering for the FALL 2025 semester at this time.

All courses in this catalogue are 1 unit. All courses are open to students at all campuses and meet on Zoom, unless otherwise mentioned.

Please note that "Core Mediation" is a required course for all students. You may enroll in Core Mediation after completion of all first year required courses. Core Mediation is not part of the Clinical Course Application, so you may register for it on your own, in Populi.

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| Core Mediation (2 units) | • <u>You Have Options</u> : Your 2 additional units made be satisfied by taking clinics (listed below) and/or by completing an approved Internship. | |
| • 2 additional clinical units | • <u>Be Prepared</u> : We <i>strongly encourage</i> you to take "Introduction to Community Legal Services" (ICLS) before enrolling in <i>either</i> a clinic or a Mediation Practicum class. | |
| | • <u>Mediation</u> : We have ONE mediation practicum class for the Fall semester: MCL Mediation Practicum. It is open to students from all campuses and meets on Zoom. You must complete Core Mediation before taking a mediation practicum class. In addition, as noted above, we strongly encourage you to take ICLS beforehand. The MCL Mediation Practicum involves more independent work, making it an advanced course. We recommend taking other clinics first before taking a MCL Mediation Practicum class. | |
| | Internships: Completing an internship with a court, law firm, or agency is a great way to get legal training and build connections with your local legal community. Internships are also an opportunity to demonstrate your talents and skills as a future attorney. Successful interns sometimes even receive job offers! But a mediocre or unsuccessful internship could have the opposite effect. We strongly encourage you to complete other clinical courses at school before applying for an internship. ICLS (strongly suggested) KCCL students who have satisfied the above pre-requisites will receive registration priority. |

| Thursday 12:00-1:00 | MCL Mediation Practicum | Hall & McCorkle | Students in Mediation Practicum mediate small claims and civil harassment cases for the Monterey County Superior Court. Mediations primarily take place remotely, via phone or Zoom, but local students may participate in person during the small claims calendar at the Marina courthouse. This class meets from 12:00-1:00 on Thursdays at least seven times during the semester. Mediations are conducted outside of class time and can be scheduled independently during normal business hours. The professors provide close guidance and supervision through the mediation process. Students may also observe small claims & civil harassment cases either in person or remotely throughout the semester. | All First Year Required Courses, including Professional Responsibility. Core Mediation ICLS (strongly suggested) At least one other clinic (strongly suggested) |
| Friday 4:00-6:00 | NEW Family Law Clinic | Standler | Assisting members of the public of Sonoma County, in person and on Zoom, with opening divorce cases. (ECL students will be in person and other students will be on Zoom.) | All First Year Required Courses, including Professional Responsibility. ICLS (strongly suggested) ECL students who have satisfied the above pre-requisites will receive registration priority. |
| Saturday 9:00-11:00 AM | Introduction to Community Legal Services ("ICLS") | Rivas | Interactive course on best practices for effectively interacting with clients. The course consists of a combination of instruction and skills practice, with a particular emphasis on simulation exercises to practice conducting client intakes and interviews, drafting client declarations and demand letters, and filling out legal forms. | All First Year Required Courses. Students may take Professional Responsibility simultaneously. |
